In terms of observance, the festival of Pentecost is the ugly step-sister of the three major church festivals, the other two being Christmas and Easter. That is really a tragedy because the coming of the Holy Spirit, which Pentecost celebrates, is what makes faith possible, what calls the Church into existence, and what creates and sustains the Church's mission.

Sundays and Seasons says this about the Day of Pentecost:

On this fiftieth day of Easter, the church gathers to celebrate the ongoing life of the Holy Spirit who is its breath, vitality, and inspiration. Through the Holy Spirit, the good news unravels age-old divisions among peoples and nations. In the waters of baptism, the Spirit gives us birth as brothers and sisters in Christ and unites people of different races, tribes, and ethnic groups. In the bread and cup of the holy supper, the Spirit nourishes our unity in worship and witness. On this day, the church offers thanksgiving to God for the very one who continues to sustain its life in each new generation and makes its prayer possible.

I had a ninth grade Sunday School teacher who used to say that the Holy Spirit is "where the action is." He understood accurately how the Spirit is at work to give us faith in the Word and sacraments, how the Spirit "prays for us when we do not know how to pray" as Paul says in Romans, how the Spirit inspires us to act on behalf of our neighbors, and how the Spirit unites the Church in the message of Jesus Christ even when other issues would threaten to divide.

Now more than ever we need the celebration of Pentecost to remind us of how faith is created in our lives, to remind us that we are not left to our own devices to accomplish God's will, and to remind us that even in the midst of differing opinions, the Spirit makes us one in Christ.

Celebrate Pentecost with us on May 15. Wear red. Join with the whole Church in praying "Come, Holy Spirit," and give thanks that this prayer is answered day after day in Christ's Church.

Every week (not every day!) you'll find four fun-filled pages of activities for experiencing the Bible. Set aside 10-15 minutes during each week to read the Bible story together, say the prayer, and consider Goliath's questions. Some weeks that might be all you can do. Other weeks you can try more of the faith sharing activities that are included. It's designed to be fun. In fact, there are even games and puzzles at the back that go along with certain weeks. The booklet is colorful and children of all ages will enjoy its format. It will also provide ideas and activities during those upcoming rainy days.

So, the Parish Ed Committee will be available during the Sunday School hour, on May 8 and 15, to show you the *Davey and Goliath Devotional* and have the subscription forms ready. The quarterly bulk subscription only costs \$1.50. (A one year subscription is only \$8.30). Zion will send in the bulk subscription and then let you know when the issues arrive. If you subscribe for the year it will be sent directly to your home. If you like, the subscription could be in your child's name.

Remember, it's always fun for them to get mail! This would be a great gift for your family.

Baccalaureate Service

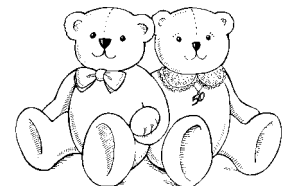

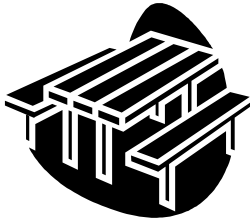

“To Mobilize Women To Act Boldly On Their Faith in Jesus Christ”

This month finds the ZLCW busy with a project called Rag Dolls 2 Love. This is described as a simple stuffed rag doll made for children all over the world who are victims of conflict, including war, sickness, family strife or natural disasters. On Monday, May 23 from 3:30 to 7:30 p.m. we are inviting you come and join us for a rag doll “work” shop. Finger food will be provided. There will be cutting, stuffing, sewing, detailing (with markers!) that will need to be done. This will be a time of sharing our time and talents with children all over the world. If you would like to make some but cannot attend this sewing date, check the ZLCW bulletin board for the pattern and directions. Can’t you just see the happy faces as they hold a doll that you helped create for them? These dolls will be collected and taken to the Annual Gathering of the SE Iowa Synod Women’s Organization in June.

In addition to the rag dolls, we will be collecting items for school and health kits to be taken to the Gathering in June. A box is provided by the ZLCW bulletin to place items for school kits: blunt scissors, rulers, pencil sharpeners, pencils, erasers, crayons, construction paper and 12x14 cloth bag with handles. Health Kits include: hand towel, wash cloth, bath-size bar of soap, toothbrush/toothpaste, wide tooth comb, metal nail file or nail clippers with file attached and band aids. These kits will be sent to the Indian Reservation in our Sister Synod in Arizona.

Thank you Group 5 for organizing our Spring Banquet. A delightful time was had by all. Just one repeated comment made was “we should do this every year – the entertainment by the youth of Muscatine was enjoyable”. We appreciate the time it took to organize the food, entertainment and decorations.

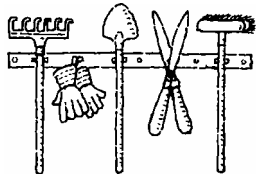
May is Social Ministry Month. The following are being sponsored by the Social Ministry Committee:

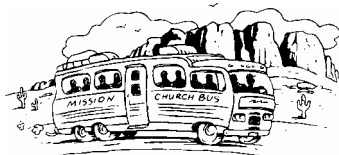
Youth Work Day **Saturday, May 14** **9:00-Noon**

Blood Drive June 2, 2005



Please save your blood donations for Zion's Blood Drive on Thursday afternoon, June 2.

We will be calling you about a time if you have donated previously. There will be someone after services on May 22 and May 29 to assign a time for new donors.

Anyone over the age of 16 and weighs over 110 pounds may donate. Most medications are acceptable including blood pressure, thyroid, non-steroid anti-inflammatory, Ritalin and allergy meds. You may also give 48 hours after taking your final dose of an antibiotic. After surgery, most are okay after being released from a doctor's care if they had not received a blood transfusion.

Remember your blood donation is very useful and needed. Many of us know if you or a loved one has ever needed blood in an emergency situation or during surgery. Hope to see you at the Blood Drive. Walk-ins are also welcome that day if you decide you do have time.
