TIME OF WORSHIP SURVEY RESULTS

On behalf of the Worship Committee, I would like to thank everyone who participated in the recent survey requesting input on the preferred time of worship. While we, as a committee, realize that change may not always be easy, it is sometimes necessary. And with any change, it is important to ask for input so that your desires or concerns are considered.

There were a total of 142 responses with 135 of those from members and 7 from non-members. 114 or 80% of the responses came from those identified as over the age of 45 and 48% of the responses came from those identified as over the age of 65.

The survey results for time of service on Sunday mornings (rounded to the nearest whole percent) is as follows:

8:00 am – 11%	9:00 am – 50%
10:00 am – 26%	Other – 12%

With this result, we will continue to hold the Sunday morning worship service at 9:00 am.

The results of the time for Sunday School and Adult Education Hour were reflective of the times of Worship: 10:15 for Sunday School with 9:00 Worship and 9:00 Sunday School with 10:00 Worship. Therefore when Sunday School begins again in September, it will remain at 10:15 am.

We also reviewed the many comments received pertaining to concerns ranging from worship music and hymns, the overall service length, uneasiness of the shaking of hands by greeters and during the sharing of the peace to recommendations for more involvement from our youth at worship.

As the Committee's goal is to make your worship experience as fulfilling as possible, we will continue to explore avenues that allow all who gather to feel comfortable in receiving the Word during our services and events. Please continue to share your thoughts, ideas and concerns with us.

Again on behalf of the Worship Committee, we thank you for your input and words of support. Blessings to each of you.

REPORT FROM THE SOUTHEASTERN IOWA SYNOD ASSEMBLY 2017

Zion was well represented this year with the following seven members attending the Southeastern Iowa Synod Assembly on May 19 and 20 at the Lutheran Church of Hope, West Des Moines: **Pastor Steve Cauley, Vicar Kyle Seibert, Katie Harris, Dave & Terri Hansen, and Patty & Bill Chrisman.** Each spring, ELCA synods gather in assembly to “lift up and celebrate ministries and address the official business of the synod”. This includes approving compensation guidelines, adopting an annual budget, addressing resolutions, and electing new members to Synod Council. This is a great opportunity to network and learn about what’s going on throughout the synod as well as partake in fellowship and sharing the word and sacrament with our ELCA partners and friends.

The assembly was presided over by our Bishop Michael Burk. The theme for this year: “GOD so LOVES the WORLD”. The assembly was greeted and opened with a video message from Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton. ELCA churchwide was represented in person by Bill Horne, ELCA Vice President, who gave a detailed summary of the key goals, accomplishments, and immediate missions of the greater church. Wonderful music for praise and worship was provided by Dakota Road Music.

Synod offering for this year was centered around the “Pigs with a Purpose” program and many of the painted and decorated wooden pigs, including Zion’s, were displayed throughout the building, representing churches and offerings gathered from congregations throughout the synod. All of the collective offerings for this assembly, over \$48,000, are going toward fighting hunger and supporting anti-hunger efforts!

In addition to the presentations of synod reports, voting on resolutions and synod council nominations, there was time for forums/break out sessions, where a number of subjects pertinent to the church and the synod were presented and discussed. Several resolutions were presented and voted on including support for ongoing anti-hunger efforts, development of a strategy for promoting proper nutrition within the first 1000 days of life, promoting and supporting the welcoming of refugees and immigrants from throughout the world, approving minimum compensation guidelines for our church leaders. The synod budget was presented and voted on for this coming year.



This was a great experience for Patty and I, who had never attended a synod assembly before. In addition to meeting some really great, hardworking, and engaged Lutherans, it was inspiring to see all of the positive impact our congregations, our synod, and the entire ELCA make at local, national, and world levels.
