Holy Communion Everlasting Light Liturgy Setting

Happy New Year! Welcome to Zion Lutheran Church on this First Sunday in Advent, the first Sunday of the new liturgical year. The new church year begins with a wake-up call: Christ is coming soon! In today's readings, both Paul and Jesus challenge us to wake from sleep, for we know neither the day nor hour of the Lord's coming. Isaiah proclaims the day when God will gather all people on the holy mountain and there will be no more war or suffering. Though we vigilantly watch for the promised day of salvation, we wait for what we already have: Christ comes among us this day as the word and meal that strengthens our faith in the promises of God.

In this Advent season we will use a different liturgy setting, Everlasting Light, and use it through the Christmas season. This Holy Communion setting uses the liturgy set to familiar Advent and Christmas tunes.

Confession & Forgiveness


In this season of light, let us go before God and confess how our words and actions contribute to the shadows instead of adding to the light. [Silence for reflection] God of Love and Light,





Isaiah 2:1-5


SECOND READING Romans 13:11-14


It is right to give our thanks and praise


+ INVITATION TO COMMUNION


