
Holy Communion Everlasting Light Liturgy Setting

Welcome to Zion Lutheran Church on this joyous Christmas Day! Today we will use a service which uses Martin Luther's "From Heaven Above" (ELW 268) as a responsive carol during the scripture readings. He based this carol on a refrain used for a 16th century singing game. In the game, the song sets up a riddle to be solved. Within the nativity story, who would have proclaimed this text?

"From heaven above to earth I come to bear good news to every home! Glad tidings of great joy I bring to all the world, and gladly sing."

In the hymn, the stanzas in quotation marks become the words of the angels rejoicing at Jesus' birth, while the other stanzas offer commentary and prayers. By sending Jesus into our world, God answers the riddle of sin and our human condition. We are set free to proclaim with the angels: "Glory to God in highest heaven, who unto us the Son has given."

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God sent from heaven above, be with you all.






Let us give thanks to the Lord our God


+ INVITATION TO COMMUNION

If you wish to receive grape juice rather than wine, please indicate this preference by approaching the communion server with your hand out and palm down. The grape juice is located in the center ring of the communion tray. All who believe in Christ as Lord and Savior, young and old, are welcome at this feast.




