All children are invited to gather with Pastor Willie at the back of the nave for the beginning of the worship service and process in waving ribbons with our gathering hymn, O Come, All Ye Faithful.

At Zion Lutheran Church we practice open communion for all of the baptized body of Christ. All who are baptized and believe in Christ as Lord and Savior are welcome to celebrate Holy Communion with us tonight.

This evening we will end the worship service using candlelight or LED finger lights while singing *Silent Night*. The acolytes will pass the light from the Christ candle to the congregation. Please dip the unlit candle into the lighted candle to prevent the hot wax from dripping on hands, clothing, or pews. LED finger lights are available for children or those who would prefer to use them. 



To us is born a Savior.







So God created humankind in his image,


in the image of God he created them;


