The Palm Sunday Liturgy recreates the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. The congregation gathers in Fellowship Hall and processes into the nave, waving palms and singing the processional hymn. We begin with shouts of "Hosanna!", then hear of Jesus clashing with religious leaders and conclude by hearing Jesus foretell his death and Judas agrees to betray him. Thus, Holy Week begins.

"HOSANNA TO THE SON OF DAVID! BLESSED IS THE ONE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD! HOSANNA IN THE HIGHEST HEAVEN!"

¹⁰ When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, "Who is this?" ¹¹ The crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee.




