What to Expect at the Synod Revival

Mainstage Access and Parking

The main stage will be outside, there is nearby parking on flat paved surfaces. We ask that participants bring a chair but there are hard surfaces to walk and set up chairs. Restrooms are nearby.

In case of inclement weather: The main stage will be held inside the Student Center which is a short walk from parking on hard surfaces. Restrooms are located in that building.

Varied Ministries Building

The varied ministries building is a short walk on paved surfaces from the mainstage area. Various ministries and organizations from around the synod and our church partners will have activities, information about their ministries, and more.

In case of inclement weather: the Varied Ministries will also be in the Student Center.

Food

Light snacks and coffee will be freely available until lunch time. There will be a \$5 lunch (hamburgers, hot dogs, a drink, a side, chips, and a cookie) and a la carte snacks available for purchase during the event. Free popcorn will be available at the varied ministries building. In case of heat, bottled water will also be available at the registration tent.

We have a team of volunteers working on activities that will be fun for ages 0-99.

Organizers have arranged for family fun activities with a special focus on kids. There will be outdoor games for adults and kids alike. Several of the varied ministries' displays have activities for children as well.

A Brief Order of

Healing and Anointing

The order for healing is an expression of the church's ministry of healing. Here all who sense the need for God's healing in any aspect of their lives may join in prayer for others and themselves. Here each person may come to receive a word of blessing and prayer. Here each one may also receive a physical gesture of healing: the laying on of hands, which may be accompanied by anointing with oil. These signs, first given in baptism, tell us again that we are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked forever with the cross of Christ, who is health and salvation for the whole world.

This ministry of healing does not replace the gifts of God that come through the scientific community nor does it promise a cure. Rather, the church offers and celebrates gifts such as these: God's presence with strength and comfort in time of suffering, God's promise of wholeness and peace, and God's love embodied in the community of faith.

WELCOME — Our Lord Jesus healed many as a sign of the reign of God come near and sent the disciples to continue this work of healing—with prayer, the laying on of hands, and anointing. In the name of Christ, the great healer and reconciler of the world, we now entrust to God all who are in need of healing.

INVOCATION

Like the first disciples before the coming of God's power at Pentecost, we wait in faith, and we pray...

Be with us, Holy Spirit; nothing can separate us from your love. Be with us as of old, fill us with your power, direct all our thoughts to your goodness. Be present, Holy Spirit; bring faith and healing and peace. Amen.

PRAYERS FOR HEALING

L: O Christ our Lord, as in times past, not all the sick and suffering found their way to your side, but had to have their hands taken, or their bodies carried, or their names mentioned. So we, confident of your goodness, bring others to you. As in times past, you looked at the faith of friends and let peace and healing be known. Look on our faith, even our little faith. Lord Jesus Christ, Lover of all,

L: We name before you those whom pain is the greatest problem; who are remembered more for their distress than their potential; who at night cry, 'I wish to God it were morning'. And in the morning cry, 'I wish to God it were night.' We pray silently or aloud... Lord Jesus Christ, Lover of all, L: We name before you those whose problem is psychological; those haunted by the nightmares of their past or the visions of their future; those whose minds are shackled to phobias, depression or fears, who do not know what is wrong or what to pray. We pray silently or aloud... Lord Jesus Christ, Lover of all,

L: We name before you those in whose experience light has turned to darkness, as the end of a life or the breaking of a relationship leaves them stunned in their souls and silent in their conversation, not knowing where to turn or whom to turn to or whether life has a purpose any more. We pray silently or aloud. Lord Jesus Christ, Lover of all, L: And others whose troubles we do not know about or whose names we would not say aloud, we mention now in the silence which you understand. We pray silently.... Lord Jesus Christ, Lover of all,

L: Lord God, you alone are skilled to know the cure for every sickness and every soul. If, by our lives, your grace may be known then in us, through us, and, if need be, despite us. Lord Jesus Christ, Lover of all,

L: On all who tend the sick, counsel the distressed, sit with the dying, or advance medical research we ask your blessing, that in caring for your people they may meet and serve their Lord. For those who, in this land, administer the agencies of health and welfare, we ask your guidance that in all they do human worth may be valued, and the service of human need be fully resourced. This we ask in the name of him whose flesh and blood have made all God's children special. We pray all this in the name of the Risen One, Jesus Christ, our Lord... Amen.



When they are afraid, give them courage; when afflicted, give them patience; when dejected, give them hope; and when alone, assure them of the support of your holy people.
