Message from Pastor Willie:

Siblings in Christ - greetings in the name of the crucified and risen one! Last month I shared with you the idea and some examples of adiaphora - those things with are indifferent or neutral, but we sometimes give them more meaning and importance than they merit. I also told you that this month I would cover the very opposite of adiaphora - central things! Specifically, that which is at the center of our worship life, which is at the center of our life together living in Christian community.

20th century German theologian and martyr of Nazi Germany, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, wrote a lovely book called *Christ the Center*. And indeed, at the center of the central things is Christ, crucified and risen. The central things of worship and of life together in community revolve around this good news and the central things directs us to this good news – both hearing it and sharing it with one another and with the world.

In all honesty, there is only enough space here to touch very briefly on the central things and I suspect they will not be unfamiliar to anyone who regularly participates in worship.

Confession & Forgiveness

We practice confession and forgiveness at most regular worship services of the church. The exception being the use of the rite of Thanksgiving for Baptism during the season of Easter, though I confess that I am somewhat uncomfortable with this thanksgiving replacing confession and forgiveness in a worship service. Confession and forgiveness are the means of grace by which God has given us means to reach reconciliation and peace within our relationship with God and with our neighbor. Sometimes called the Office of the Keys, Lutheran practice both corporate and private confession and forgiveness. The presiding minister declares God's forgiveness of sins through God's love and grace and we are expected to practice this within our own relationships as well, both when we have caused harm and been harmed.

Proclamation of God's Word

If someone were to plan a worship service without including scripture, I would consider the service woefully incomplete. The gathered body of Christ hears God's Word together in worship, both through the public reading of scripture and through the preaching of the living Word of God - Christ, crucified and risen - to the congregation.

Prayer

We pray together in worship and privately because this is the means by which we can communicate with God. We have prayers formed by the theme of the scriptures for the day, prayers of intercession, prayers of thanksgiving following the offering and Holy Communion, and the Lord's Prayer. We pray together because God's people have prayed for millennia in relationship with God.

Message from Pastor Willie Cont'd):

Sacraments

We celebrate the sacraments regularly in worship. Holy Baptism as we welcome new members into the body of Christ and into the mission we share, celebrating with them as they receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and God's forgiveness and grace as the baptized body of Christ is united by Holy Baptism to Christ's death and resurrection. Through Holy Baptism we receive new birth and new life.

In Holy Communion we celebrate and receive the true presence of Christ in, with, and under the bread and the wine, received by the faith given to us by the power of the Holy Spirit in baptism. This is not merely a meal of remembrance, this is a means by which we receive God's grace and forgiveness through the presence of Christ's body and blood in the bread and the wine. We join with the great communion of saints who are gathered at the feast of the Lord's Table. We cannot truly and fully understand how God joins us together with the Church throughout the world and the saints who have gone before us, but we trust in God's faithfulness and the mystery of this meal, from the youngest to the oldest, we place our trust in God that we receive this meal with grateful and faithful hearts.

Sharing the Good News

All of these central things lead us to the dismissal at the end of the service. This may seem like a nice way to close the service so that everyone knows that worship has ended, but the word "dismissal" is from the Latin *dismissus* which means "to be sent out". The worship service may have ended, but our work in sharing the good news of God's love and grace does not end. We are called, equipped, and sent into the world to share the gospel with the world!

These are the central things of Christian worship. They revolve around the good news of Christ crucified and risen at the center of our faith. They include the means by which we receive God's grace and forgiveness and how we are renewed in faith, hope, and love. Everything else is details – from candles to paraments to the songs we sing. These things may point us to the central things. But let us remember to keep the central things the central things so that we can keep our worship and our lives centered on the good news of Christ crucified and risen.



What to Expect at the Synod Revival

Mainstage Access and Parking

The main stage will be outside, there is nearby parking on flat paved surfaces. We ask that participants bring a chair but there are hard surfaces to walk and set up chairs. Restrooms are nearby.

In case of inclement weather: The main stage will be held inside the Student Center which is a short walk from parking on hard surfaces. Restrooms are located in that building.

Varied Ministries Building

The varied ministries building is a short walk on paved surfaces from the mainstage area. Various ministries and organizations from around the synod and our church partners will have activities, information about their ministries, and more.

In case of inclement weather: the Varied Ministries will also be in the Student Center.

Food

Light snacks and coffee will be freely available until lunch time. There will be a \$5 lunch (hamburgers, hot dogs, a drink, a side, chips, and a cookie) and a la carte snacks available for purchase during the event. Free popcorn will be available at the varied ministries building. In case of heat, bottled water will also be available at the registration tent.

Will there be things for kids to do?

We have a team of volunteers working on activities that will be fun for ages 0-99.

Organizers have arranged for family fun activities with a special focus on kids. There will be outdoor games for adults and kids alike. Several of the varied ministries' displays have activities for children as well.

We are working hard to ensure that this is an event for all and volunteers will be onsite to assist. The main areas of the revival are all accessible by paved surfaces and ADA-accessible buildings.
