**Reformation Day** commemorates the day in 1517 when a German monk named Martin Luther (1483-1546) strode up to the church in Wittenburg and nailed his 95 'theses' (or propositions) to the church door.

Luther chose to do this on October 31st as he knew the church would be full on the next day for All Saints' Day.

Luther's intention when posting his theses was to highlight the practice of indulgences in the Roman Catholic Church. Indulgences were pardons from sin that could be bought, meaning that those who were rich enough could buy forgiveness for all manner of sins.

Luther had hoped that pinning his protestations would spark wider debate and harden public opinion against the practice.

However, so many people agreed with his ideas that they quickly spread across western Europe, helped by the recent invention of the printing press, leading to the religious revolt known as the Reformation.

The reformation led many Christians to break off from the Roman Catholic Church and establish new, independent churches of their own, such as the Lutheran Church.

In 2010, around 37% of all Christians around the world identified as Protestants, according to the Pew Research Center.

## Message from Pastor Willie:

Siblings in Christ – greetings in the name of our risen Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ!

I give thanks for the opportunity to serve with you here at Zion Lutheran Church. The more I get to know the ministries of the congregation and the members of the body of Christ here at Zion, the better I can serve with you all as the pastor of this congregation. I give thanks for everyone involved in the ministries of Zion! We have an active quilting group, an active parish education group who is willing to try new things for Sunday School and faith formation, both here at Zion and with the ministry collaboration, Faith Together Muscatine, we have with Shepherd of the Cross and Grace Lutheran. The Memorial Committee has experienced significant changes in leadership and we give thanks for members of that committee who faithfully served for decades who have now passed the reins to new leadership. I am thankful for the home communion ministers and for each and every one of you who visits our sick and homebound people.

As we look ahead to Confirmation Sunday on October 29th, I am thankful for Jackson Evans, Dalton Bozarth, Mason Smith, and Elise Freberg who all experienced a significant transition, moving from confirmation classes with only Zion students and leaders to joining with Family Faith Night and new students and adult leaders. Please keep these four in your prayers as they prepare to make public affirmation of their baptisms on October 29th!

The next couple of months are traditionally known as "Stewardship Season" in many churches. This is a time when we ask you to prayerfully consider what you are able to financially contribute to God's ministry here at Zion as we look ahead to 2024 and the financial needs of the congregation. While we do have a significant "cushion" with finances, when we look at the current budget year we are \$35,000 in the red, which is not a sustainable rate of deficit for the long-term. As you approach the final quarter of 2023, please consider an increase in your regular offering contributions to help stem the tide of this financial shortfall.

Last, and certainly not least, I know that Zion has had interns in recent years. The church council asked me to contact Wartburg Theological Seminary to see if we can serve as an internship site for a student preparing for rostered ministry. It seems strange, but the first step in the application process is for the council to appoint an Internship Committee. If you have an interest in serving on the Internship Committee, please let me or Tyler know as soon as possible.

Thank you all for your faithful service with Zion Lutheran Church! I look forward to continuing learning about and helping lead our ministries here at Zion and learning more about each of you and your gifts for ministry.



At LSI, we celebrate all the ways professional caregivers help children and adults achieve their goals and build meaningful connections in their communities. LSI's Host Homes program is an innovative way Direct Support Professionals serve adults with disabilities.

Through this program, an individual moves from Supported Community Living into a private family home with a carefully selected Host Homes Provider who provides 24/7 support for the client.

"Working directly with my clients to help them complete goals and work around obstacles is my favorite part of my job," said Erica Hill Murray, a Host Homes Provider at LSI. "I enjoy showing them that there are people in their lives who care about them, are proud of them, and proud to help them."

Erica has helped many clients in the five years she has provided care at LSI, but one client, in particular, has made great strides under her care. "I worked with a client who wanted to find a job or volunteer position, but she had two obstacles in her way: she had trouble using a computer, and she wasn't confident in her ability to speak in an interview," said Erica.

"I offered to look for positions on the computer with her and to call potential employers to explain what she was looking for. After working with her, we found her a volunteer position for a couple of days a week, and she was delighted."

"She thanked me for helping her and said that she was happy that, for once, someone understood her drive to want to work," said Erica. "I like to make a difference – even if it is small. Helping others, no matter at what level, is impactful. I love working at LSI, and I believe my position as a Host Homes Provider has been my favorite position in life."
