



He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. ⁶Then he said to his slaves, 'The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. ⁶Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet.' ¹oThose slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests.
