Adult Bible Study

Date change for the Contact

Beginning in February of 2024, we will change the publication date of the Contact from the beginning of the month to approximately 10 days into the month. Annual Meeting - January 21, 2024

Consistent with the following provisions C10.03 of the Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church Constitution, this is the announcement of the annual meeting of the congregation. The meeting will occur following the 9:00 a.m. worship service on Sunday, January 21, 2024. There will be a voting roster for the meeting. Voting membership is determined by C8.02.c.:

C8.02.c. Voting members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of this congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws. They shall not have voted as a seasonal member of another congregation of this church in the previous two calendar months

Constitutional provisions for notice of congregation meetings, quorum, and voting methods:

C10.03. Notice of all meetings of this congregation shall be given at the services of worship on the preceding two consecutive Sundays and by mail or electronic means, as permitted by state law, to all voting members at least 10 days in advance of the date of the meeting.

C10.04. Five percent of the voting members shall constitute a quorum.

C10.05. Voting by proxy or by absentee ballot shall not be permitted.
