**Lent:** Purple is typically associated with Lent, suggesting repentance and solemnity.

**Sunday of the Passion:** Scarlet is the preferred color of this first day of Holy Week, as it suggests the deep color of blood. (Scarlet is to be distinguished from the brighter color of red, which is appointed for the Day of Pentecost,

**Days of Holy Week:** Scarlet or purple may be used for Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week.

**Maundy Thursday:** For this fourth day of Holy Week, celebrated as the institution of the Lord's Supper, scarlet or white is used.

**Good Friday:** No vestments or paraments are used on this day, after the stripping of the altar on Maundy Thursday night.

**Vigil of Easter:** White or Gold suggests of joy in the Resurrection is used on this night. Easter Day: Gold or white is suggested for this day. The gold color symbolizes that this day is the "queen of feasts," unique in the entire church year.

## Message from Pastor Willie:

Fellow saints and sinners, greetings in the name of our risen Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ!

I find myself rather anxious this time of year because of the number of transitions happening in various places. The weather outside is no longer frightful, though we have not finished up with whatever March may have in store for us. This morning, after a night of gentle rain, I found nightcrawlers all over the driveway. My garlic tells me that we have entered the growing season as some varieties have already reached six inches above the mulch. I put seed for radishes, carrots, kohlrabi, beets, and sugar snap peas in the ground before the end of February and I saw the very first sprouts this morning. The earth and her creatures are waking up from a bit of a strange winter.

I traveled yesterday to bring Belle home from Bloomington, Indiana for Spring Break and we will have the entire family under one roof during spring break this coming week. Which means that Grace and Belle are making summer plans for employment, transitioning from school to summer break.

As we continue the journey through Lent, we will soon transition to Holy Week and Easter celebrations to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and his defeat of sin, death, and the devil through the cross and an empty tomb.

I find myself anxious this time of year, largely because of the challenges of keeping up with life. In times like these I lean into the sanctuary of daily prayer, scripture reading, and worship services. I am particularly drawn to the simple and reflective nature of the Midweek Lent services, which provide us with time to enjoy the presence of one another, gathered around God's Word with siblings in Christ, followed by a meal and fellowship.

I know that I am not the only person who encounters this season of transitions. If this time of year raises anxiety over the unknown, I encourage you to lean into God's Word. Observe the world around you, enjoy the warm sun and the gentle patter of rain quenching the ground which desperately needs moisture. Join us for worship on Sunday mornings, Sunday evenings (March 24 and April 14 & 28), Midweek Lent, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. Sanctuary means "a place of refuge and protection". Gathering for worship together with others in our sanctuary provides us with a place of refuge and protection, a place of rejuvenation and connection with God and with one another, and a place where heaven and earth come together. Please join us for any and all of these worship opportunities. Bring your joys, sorrows, laments, and anxieties and lay them at the feet of the cross. To quote 1 Peter 5:6-7, cast your burdens onto Jesus, for he cares for you.

Diamond Dave's 5:30**

We are reading a book that Pastor Susan Bantz recommended that she has just finished reading. It is "Delicious" by Ruth Reichl. There are used copies available cheaply. And probably at the library.



Ruth Reichl is a born storyteller. Through her restaurant reviews, where she celebrated the pleasures of a well-made meal, and her bestselling memoirs that address our universal feelings of love and loss, Reichl has achieved a special place in the hearts of hundreds of thousands of readers. Now, with this magical debut novel, she has created a sumptuous, wholly realized world that will enchant you.

Billie Breslin has traveled far from her home in California to take a job at *Delicious!*, New York's most iconic food magazine. Away from her family, particularly her older sister, Genie, Billie feels like a fish out of water—until she is welcomed by the magazine's colorful staff. She is also seduced by the vibrant downtown food scene, especially by Fontanari's, the famous Italian food shop where she works on weekends. Then *Delicious!* is abruptly shut down, but Billie agrees to stay on in the empty office, maintaining the hotline for reader complaints in order to pay her bills.

To Billie's surprise, the lonely job becomes the portal to a miraculous discovery. In a hidden room in the magazine's library, Billie finds a cache of letters written during World War II by Lulu Swan, a plucky twelve-year-old, to the legendary chef James Beard. Lulu's letters provide Billie with a richer understanding of history, and a feeling of deep connection to the young writer whose courage in the face of hardship inspires Billie to come to terms with her fears, her big sister and her ability to open her heart to love.

March is National Professional Social Work Month, a time to recognize social workers and thank them for all they do. At Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI), we are grateful for the many social workers who have dedicated their lives to serving our communities across the state!

At LSI, we believe every Iowan deserves the independence they need to thrive. LSI's Host Homes is an innovative way LSI is serving adults with disabilities. Through this program, an individual moves from Supported Community Living into a private family home with a carefully selected mentor. This program is built entirely around an individual's goals and interests, and LSI's extensive matching process ensures the mentor and mentee are a great fit.

Take a moment to read the following story from a Host Homes mentee:

“My journey with LSI's Host Homes started in early 2023. I've known my mentor for a few years while he provided hourly services to me. We learned about Host Homes and thought it would be a good fit for us. I moved into my mentor's home where he helps me maintain a daily routine with schoolwork, household tasks, daily living skills, improving independence, and more. I attend a college nearby and go to classes a few days a week. I am able to navigate the local bus system to access my community to attend classes and visit friends. My mentor is always available to transport me into the community as needed.

This summer, I went on a trip across the country with one of my classes. While on this trip, I was able to maintain my independence with limited support, but I knew my mentor would be available by phone to assist me with my coping skills and problem solving. This trip was a big success for me knowing I had support only a phone call away. I like LSI's Host Homes Program because my mentor supports me in the way I want to be supported, assists me with some daily tasks I struggle with, and understands me.”


