WHY DECEMBER 25TH FOR CHRISTMAS DAY?

One very common theory is that Christianity simply adopted pagan festivals and traditions around winter solstice and Sol Invictus (the Unconquered Sun), established by Emperor Aurelian in 274 C.E. Early celebrations of Christmas are thought to have derived from Roman and other European festivals that marked the end of the harvest, and the winter solstice.

However, in about 200 C.E., Tertullian of Carthage calculated that the day of the crucifixion (according to the Gospel of John) was March 25th in the Roman calendar. There was a belief in the early church that Jesus died on the same day he was conceived. The Christian celebration of the Annunciation of Our Lord is celebrated on March 25th, nine months before December 25th, which provides an earlier and different reason for choosing December 25th as the date of Jesus' birth. Following Emperor Constantine's legalization of Christianity in the 4th century, the Christmas celebration began to deliberately adapt pagan traditions into the Christmas celebration.




