The Palm Sunday Liturgy recreates the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem as the congregation gathers at the back of the sanctuary, we wave our palms and make our procession into the sanctuary.

We begin with shouts of “Hosanna!”, then hear of Jesus clashing with religious leaders and conclude by hearing Jesus foretell his death and Judas agrees to betray him. Thus, Holy Week begins.
